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#### Being Independent

Nursery is used as a stepping stone to prepare your child for when they start going to school. It is vital that your child can be independent when they start school. You can encourage this at home by supporting them to manage their own coat, use the toilet and to overcome problems.

#### Mark Making

The children are encouraged every day to join in with 'Write Dance' sessions and to write their names at nursery. Any drawing, painting or printing you can enjoy with your child at home world enhance these skills.

#### Speaking and Listening

During your child's time at Nursery we always try to encourage as much communication from and between the children as possible. It is extremely important they are able to speak and listen to their peers and the adults within the group. You can encourage these skills by talking to your child and sharing books together.

#### Things to remember

In Nursery we have 'Nature Detective' sessions every Wednesday. During these sessions your child will need warm clothing and wellington boots if possible. On Fridays, the children go to the school hall to experience PE lessons. Please can you ensure your child is wearing pumps or trainers every Friday.
