Through history, we want our children to gain a coherent knowledge and understanding of Britain's history, their locality, and the history of the wider world. We want our children to think deeply about the people and places in the


past and how they are linked to society today. They will become familiar with using historical enquiry and have a good understanding of chronology.

PE
