



ENGLISH

Our class texts for Autumn are going to be **The Boy at the Back of the Class** by Onjali Q. Raúf and **VI Spy** by Maz Evans. We will be using our class texts for some of our writing units, and we will be writing some narratives, persuasive adverts and exploring the setting in a story opening. This term we will be concentrating on developing use of punctuation, spelling, powerful vocabulary, more interesting sentence construction and use of correct grammar.

Across the term we will be working on a range of spellings (which will be set on Spelling Shed) and continue to develop the children's accuracy in grammar and punctuation. Children will regularly read and quiz on their AR books which they can bring home every day.

History

During history lessons, we will be looking at the time of the Egyptians. We will be looking at the various achievements they made during their era by reflecting on artefacts and sources that remain. As part of the topic, we will also be looking at how different groups of people contributed to this.

Geography

Our topic in geography is 'The Americas'. Pupils will explore various cities, states and countries across both North and South America. In the final week, pupils will write a travel itinerary explaining where they would visit and why.

Science

Our first science topic will be about the human body. We will be looking at how the organs in the digestive system work and the importance of our teeth. Our second topic will focus on how both animals and plants are classified. We will find out what a vertebrate and invertebrate are.

Computing

In our first computing unit, pupils will plan, create, develop and test their own educational game. Our second unit will focus on developing a micro: bit project using the MakeCode programme.

Music

For music, 4AW will be learning to play the glockenspiel, before moving on to learn to sing the soul song 'lean on me'. 4AMB will be having ukulele lessons this term. They will need to bring in their ukulele every **Thursday**.

RE

During Autumn, we will be finding out who Sikhs are and what they believe, and we will learn about the importance of Bethlehem to Christians. We will also find out what a pilgrimage is.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be learning about being part of a class and school community, exploring how our actions effect the whole group. We will also find out what democracy means and how this is used in school. through our school council.

PE

During the 'Athletics' unit children will develop and apply their running, jumping and throwing techniques. The second unit is 'Dodgeball' which will develop their throwing, dodging and catching. They will also be taking part in 'Circuit Training' to improve their overall fitness. Our PE lessons will be on Wednesday and Thursday.

MATHS

In Maths, we will continue to develop the key skills children have already been taught as well as introduce new concepts.

In Arithmetic, we will read and write numbers up to 5 digits, understanding the place value as we do this. We will learn to round numbers to 10, 100 and 1000. We will also learn to read, write, and convert between fractions and decimals. Another focus will be comparing and converting between different units of measure, which we will then use to solve word problems involving measures and money.

This year, children will also be sitting the Multiplication Tables Check in June, therefore please ensure you practise these at home.

Art

Our art lessons will focus on plant art. Pupils will be developing their observational skills by creating detailed illustrations and learning how to create tints, shades and tones of colours. Pupils will be exploring work produced by artist Oral Kiely and reproducing prints in her artistic style.

DT

During DT, pupils will be developing their sewing skills by making seasonal stockings. Pupils will have to analyse existing products, practice their sewing skills and design their own stocking before going on to produce their very own.
